

Phase three at Brook Valley Gardens will create 137 new homes which will sit along wide, tree-lined avenues created to complement the area's green surroundings.

Brook Valley Gardens has been designed by Alison Brooks Architects as a sustainable suburban development with residents' needs at its heart.

The development benefits from a vast amount of green spaces, and each home has a sense of privacy, with the gardens not being overlooked.

Inspiration for Brook Valley Gardens has been taken from some of the best neighbouring streets, making a note of the materials and architectural style used in the area, ensuring the new development seamlessly blends in with its surroundings.

To encapsulate modern living, the architects have put sustainability at the forefront of Brook Valley Gardens' design. Various measures have been taken to help reduce carbon emissions, such as rainwater harvesting, increasing local biodiversity and community recycling.

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Stunning green open spaces

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The rewards and pleasure of being immersed in nature has long been recognised, but we are appreciating the effect on our wellbeing like never before. Living at Brook Valley Gardens means being able to connect in every way to a rich tapestry of green open spaces.



Every green space has its own special character, sights and sounds, so from the bright colours of summer wildflowers and trickling water on river walks, the birdsong in the trees on a woodland path, or catching sight of the wildlife who call these spaces home, you will discover a special place - your own favourite habitat.

Parks with play areas are perfect for energetic youngsters, and there is no need to only explore on foot. Cycle paths in parkland and Commons are the perfect setting to take to two wheels - whatever your age.



Dollis Valley Greenwalk

- 0.8 miles

Linking Moat Mount to Hampstead Heath, the 10-mile, long distance footpath follows Dollis Brook, creating a green corridor which connects the local open spaces.

Covert Way Nature Reserve \$ Monken Hadley Common - 2.0 miles

This local nature reserve is the ideal spot for a leisurely weekend stroll. Walk amongst the mixture of hornbeam, oak and beech trees for some well-earned escapism.

Moat Mount Open Space - 2.0 miles

A 110-hectare park and nature reserve, where you can take in its magnificent views from the top of the hill. Dollis Brook rises within Moat Mount, which is also home to an Outdoor Activity Centre for orienteering, adventure courses, and camping.



Totteridge Fields & Nature Reserve

- 1.9 miles

Totteridge Fields and its surroundings are the perfect place to spend a sunny Sunday afternoon. Keep an eye out for wildlife in the ancient meadow habitat consisting of three fields known as Nutt Field, Hen Mead and Nearer Slay Land.

Totteridge Common

- 2.7 miles

This popular nature reserve is home to five ponds. Each vary in character but all offer a great opportunity to spot dragonflies and amphibians.

Oak Hill Park - 3.3 miles

A great place for a family day out. As well as offering leisurely strolls amongst the mature oak trees, Oak Hill offers play areas for youngsters, tennis courts, an outdoor gym, bowls and cricket facilities and a cafe to grab some refreshments.



Trent Country Park - 4.3 miles

A green haven located just outside Barnet. Enjoy the glorious countryside and farmland, there is also a golf course and an equestrian centre. As well as miles and miles of relaxing walks amidst serene fields and enchanting woodland.

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

It couldn't be easier

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Barnet is ideally located to connect you to the city and beyond. High Barnet station is on the Northern Line with the City branch connecting you to Moorgate and Bank in less than 40 minutes. The Charing Cross branch takes you direct to the West End at Tottenham Court Road and Leicester Square. High Barnet also runs directly into King's Cross St Pancras for Eurostar services.

Road links

Not to be overshadowed by the rail links, Brook Valley Gardens is also ideally located to access the strategic road links of the A1, M25, and M1, with the A1/M25 intersection four miles away and junction 2 of the M1 six miles.

Travel by bus

Taking the bus is a green way to travel, and the 184 route runs along Mays Lane, with frequent services running every 10 minutes, taking in Barnet High Street, Wood Green, and New Barnet.

For additional convenience a new bus route will run through the development.

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


Central London is a global magnet, and at Brook Valley Gardens you can explore the buzzing quarters of the capital with just a few stops on the Northern Line.

10:00

From High Barnet to Leicester Square is just over half an hour on the Northern Line. Start the day with a coffee in one of many boulangeries serving the perfect flat white and fresh-fromthe-oven pastry.

11:00

Explore London's new 'mile of style', Regent Street, reborn today as one of London's best shopping hubs for contemporary brands like Superdry and Guess, Arket and Kiko Milano.

13:00

Time for lunch. Make the most of being so close to Chinatown, the only problem is deciding which restaurant, or which of a hundred types of dim sum served at officially London's best dim sum specialists.

15:00

Head over to Covent Garden with great shopping in its iconic cobbled setting. Check out the premium brands in the colonnades, the artisanmade arty stuff at the market, and of course the street performers.

18:00

Time for a cocktail or pre-theatre tipple. Covent Garden's night-time scene is electric. How about a basement pisco bar mixing up on-trend colourful South American cocktails and Latin rhythms.

19:00

Head to Theatreland along Shaftsbury Avenue for the biggest productions in town. After the show if it's Friday or Saturday no need to rush for the last tube – the Night Tube runs back to High Barnet.


